
Crisis Intervention

BAY AREA CRISIS NURSERY What is a crisis nursery?

The purpose of the Bay Area Crisis Nursery (BACN) is to prevent abuse and neglect of children by providing support to families who are in crisis or under stress. BACN is a short term residential care facility for young children of families in a time of personal crisis. We serve families with parents who care but temporarily can't cope with overwhelming, stressful life emergencies.

WHO ARE THE CLIENTS?

- Families under extraordinary stress
- Parents that just need a break and support

WHAT MAKES BACN UNIQUE?

Since 1981, BACN is the only crisis nursery in the Bay Area offering free, voluntary and confidential childcare services.

Our nonprofit organization has two sites providing 24-hour residential care for children: the Nursery for children birth through age five, and the Dahlstrom House for children age six through eleven. Here children receive shelter, food, clothing, toys and tender care while parents develop a plan of action to resolve the crisis and/or alleviate the stress.
