

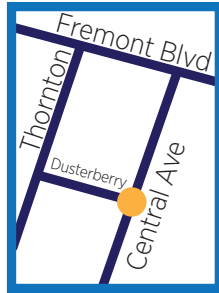

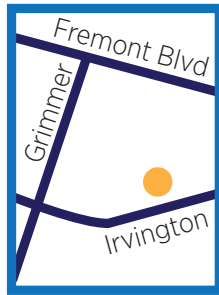

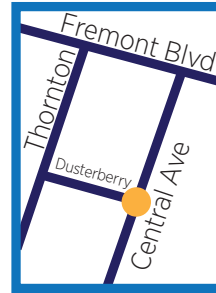

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE ON THE HOPE MOBILE CLINIC?

MEDICAL SERVICES

Our nurse practitioners and physician assistants can help you with:

- Hypertension (blood pressure)
- Diabetes
- Asthma
- Cold and flu symptoms
- Infections
- Medi-Cal enrollment
- Wound care
- Acute illnesses
- STD/HIV testing
- Birth control
- Harm reduction supplies
- Pregnancy testing
- Smoking cessation



Medical services are provided by our collaborative partner:



SOCIAL SERVICES

Meet with one of our outreach and support specialists to discuss:

- Applying for benefits — food stamps, GA, SSI, etc.
- Coordinated entry assessments
- Mental health support and referrals
- Drug or alcohol detox/treatment referrals
- Getting documentation — ID, birth certificate, etc.
- Legal referrals and support
- Veterans' services
- Eye and dental appointment referrals
- Veterinary referrals
- Banking and credit issues
- Employment support — résumés, searching, etc.
- Access to receiving post mail
- Hygiene supplies
- Clothing and sleeping bags
- Info regarding housing and shelters

WHO CAN USE HOPE SERVICES?

Because of funding requirements, HOPE clients must be homeless. You are eligible if you live:

- On the streets
- In a vehicle
- In an abandoned building
- Anywhere not meant for habitation
- Fleeing domestic violence
- In a shelter

HOPE services are provided free of charge.
